AMEND APPROVAL

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this item is to request your approval of the amended regulation, COMAR13A.12.03.02, School Counselor.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND:

At your February 28, 2012 meeting, you reviewed proposed changes to the aforementioned regulation and determined that a Joint Conference Committee was not needed. The proposed changes were originally published in the *Maryland Register* on May 4, 2012.

The public comment period ended July 5, 2012. One local school system submitted three comments: one was editorial; staff concurred with this comment. A second comment was substantive and directly opposed the proposed change that would allow an experienced School Counselor to seek Maryland certification; staff did not concur with this comment. The third comment was partially editorial; staff did not concur with this comment since this wording is consistent with wording throughout regulation.

Inadvertently, the changes which were editorial in nature were not included in the final publication of the regulation after adoption. Upon advice of Legal Counsel, it was necessary to republish the regulation. The Professional Standards and Teacher Education Board (PSTEB) approved the regulation for republication at its October 4, 2012 meeting. At your October 31, 2012 meeting, you determined that a Joint Conference Committee was not necessary and the regulation, as amended, was published in the Maryland Register on December 28, 2012. A copy of the proposed changes is attached; the public comment ended January 28, 2012. No comments were received. The proposed regulation does not have any economic impact nor does it have an impact on individual with disabilities. There is no corresponding federal standard for the proposed action.
